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Migration has always existed and has always responded to the fundamental need of people to ensure their survival. However, current migration policy endangers those who leave their countries to ensure their safety and that of their children. Building from electoral recognition, current policies turn nationals against these new arrivals on the basis of their socio-economic orientations.

This booklet summarizes all the projects carried out by Le Monde des Possibles since 2006. Some of them are inherent to the functioning of the association, while others are of a more ad hoc nature. Through this mosaic of actions, several common threads emerge which are specific to the philosophical identity of Le Monde des Possibles and are real drivers of the nature of our activities: the defence of an economic and social policy that is respectful of fundamental rights, the specific fight for the rights of migrants, undocumented and unemployed workers, women and young people, the creation of collectives resulting from intercultural dynamics, and the critical joint exercise of political and cultural action. All these projects, as diversified as they may be, are, each in their own way, crosscutting and promote the co-creation of direct action by participants in the social, cultural and political life in Liège.

Our NPO is always open and welcomes newcomers wishing to learn French as a foreign language and computer skills all year-round. Every week, 200 people from 54 nationalities and speaking 410 languages take part in intercultural activities.

French as a Foreign Language courses at Le Monde des Possibles are taught to 200 people every week (54 nationalities) and are divided into 5 levels.

Learning a language is a complex process that involves multiple intelligences and societal dimensions. We offer a collective path towards autonomy and awareness of the rights and duties of the participants: to be able to communicate, to dare to speak, to interact with society, to understand what is at stake, to be in solidarity with newcomers.

Through our ILI (Local Integration Initiatives) accreditation, we offer, in conjunction with the French as a Foreign Language courses, citizenship trainings adapted to the participants' level of proficiency in French. The Citizen Orientation Workshops (AOC) are aimed at people who are beginners in French. The Citizen Integration Training (FIC) is intended for those who have a good level of mastery of French (about A2 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). Registrations are open every Monday morning between 9AM and 12AM. A placement test is then organized to ensure rapid insertion into a collective learning process.

FLE ON LIVE courses work on the four skills (listening and reading comprehension, oral and written expression) emphasizing on interaction as a source of learning. The themes covered will be related to the daily lives of participants: their habits, the city, food, physical description, etc. All the activities are part of a communicative and intercultural approach where the identity of each person is valued:

- Career-oriented FLE courses: specific workshops will be offered in order to work on the vocabulary specific to job search, to guide participants in their career path, to build job search tools, to explain how the job market in Belgium works, etc.

- Production of radio broadcasts: a specific workshop will enable its beneficiaries to familiarise themselves with the media and more particularly the radio. This activity is part of a project that will be carried out by the participants. They will define a theme around which they will co-construct the content of a program that will then be broadcast.

- Development of an action plan in collaboration with the social service in order to ensure the guidance of the participants.

The legal and social service of Le Monde des Possibles is aimed at people of foreign origin — French-speaking or not — who are looking for support in their daily life regardless of their residence status. It offers a global and multidisciplinary follow-up to fight against social exclusion, but also allows people to find a safe place to be heard. It acts as a real mediator between people and institutions. The team works in a network of associations and structures in Liège working for migrants. Its work is complemented by a permanent staff from the CEPAG (Popular Education Centre André Genot) on the work-related side, and from the MRAX (Movement against racism, anti-Semitism and xenophobia), which collects complaints in case of racism or discrimination.

The role of the legal and social service is thus to accompany people to overcome their difficulties and get opportunities for emancipation. It is therefore part of the training axis of the NPO as it provides information on the steps and organizations that can improve their situation.

In addition to these activities, the social service works specifically on the issue of housing: the Casa Amigas project offers loans and deposits to promote access to

housing for recognised refugees. The Aqualis project, for its part, raises awareness about access to water and lends tools in order to maintain housing.

Our legal and social service offers support in the following areas:

- Foreigners' rights: asylum, regularisations, etc.
- Family: marriage, legal cohabitation, family reunification
- Justice
- Citizenship: access and advocacy
- Fight against racism and discrimination
- Housing: access and maintenance, relations with the CPAS (public welfare centre) and the owners, access to water and energies
- Administrative and financial matters
- Health: health insurance, emergency medical aid, prevention and guidance
- Employment and training

Asylum seekers' journeys into exile are marked by difficulties that can negatively influence their learning and integration into civil society. In order to discover the city of Liège, get tips and tricks to live (and survive) and find a better approach to support asylum seekers waiting in open Red Cross centres, Le Monde des Possibles offers several 2-week training modules every year to the residents of these centres (Manhay, Nonceveux, Manderfeld, Bierset, Ans, Eupen, Fraipont, Banneux).

Training modules :

1. "Computer science and new technologies"
2. "Post step centre" (legal and social information, socio-professional integration)

The long-term objective of this initiative is to achieve an integrated approach to training projects for candidate refugees that is of high quality and reflects the specificities of this audience. The project aims to discover solidarity in Liège and meet the operators from the numerous services. Together with the actions to call on civil society, individual follow-up to guide them in their search for employment (and/or skills training) is offered in order to revitalize the waiting period and to enhance personal resources and potential.

IBM MORE aims to support VET teachers and trainers with innovative tools and methods to stimulate innovation, digital, intercultural, and entrepreneurship competences of VET learners through app—based learning. IBM MORE explores a wider understanding of refugee integration as a means to participatory community development in the Social and Solidarity Economy sectors. Capacity-building in the benefitting communities is not merely a pooling of professional knowledge and resources, but the empowerment of the whole benefitting community and third-country nationals to build a strong community that takes into account the needs of both newcomers and of locals.

Four partners from Austria, Belgium, Norway, and Spain — with strong expertise in entrepreneurship education, migrant integration, and VET systems — will work together to achieve the following results:

- Online Digital Database of good practices and intercultural resources for Migrant Entrepreneurs (based on the needs framework identified through comparative analysis)
- Conceptualization and creation of a training curriculum based on European Key Competencies (EKC) on digital training platform for learning via Apps
- IBM-MORE pedagogical handbook for transferability in a European context

Migrants have linguistic talents that can structure a social interpreting service in Liège. Associations need these skills to fulfil their missions with audiences of foreign origin. The Univerbal project offers innovative workshops to enhance the know-how, talents and skills of migrants in the linguistic field. It is part of a pre-professional approach that aims to training 16 migrants towards the B2/C1 level on the Europass scale. Two 3-month sessions are planned each year. Each session comprises 150 hours of training and work experience.

Initially financed by the European Social Fund, Univerbal will give a positive and professional image of the migrants we have been accompanying for 18 years in Le Monde des Possibles. We support their internship in associations and public administrations where their know-how can be part of a professional project that fights against the ethno-stratification of the labour market and gender discrimination.

The Univerbal project is committed to the recognition of the language skills of migrants and to the development of training courses for future interpreters in social settings. The social interpretation service lists many languages including Arabic, Kurdish, Albanian, Dari, Pashto, Turkish, Kinyarwanda, Afar, Spanish, Somali and more.

The interpreters in the service are all native speakers of the languages offered, who have recently arrived in Belgium or have been there for a longer period of time. The interpreters and translators know from the inside the migrants' journey to Belgium, the administrative procedures that need to be completed and the problems of asylum applications in Belgium. They have followed a training course in interpretation in a social environment (Trialog or Univerbal) given by Le Monde des Possibles in partnership with the Regional Integration Centre of Liège, the Red Cross, CPAS,...

Our interpreting and translation service was created in partnership with operators who have a high demand for linguistic support. The aim is to enable everyone to express themselves in a mastered and known language allowing optimal communication between front-line

operators and users. Our specificity is centred on the following themes and lexical fields: social support (CPAS, schools, regional integration centres), support in the asylum procedure (Red Cross, lawyer), health and basic medical support (family planning, awareness raising, general visit to the doctor, gynaecological visit).

It is also a question of recognizing the profession of social interpreter as a profession requiring training, hosting and support before and after any interpreting session, hence the important link with the training component of the Univerbal project.



The Redém'arts project is a training program that offers young NEETs (Not in Education, Employment or Training) people from the region of Liège training, support and professional experience in the fields of digital and performing arts in order to promote their access to the labour market. Through creative disciplines and new technologies, Redém'arts primarily wishes to give young people the opportunity to regain self-confidence, have trust in their ability to achieve results in terms of acquisition of skills and know-how. Secondly, the project aims to lead them towards a job and/or training by working on non-formal skills that they reject because of their background (artistic mediation and lifelong learning).

Each session will be divided into several modules according to the professions to be discovered (visits and meetings with potential employers and adapted training locations), orientation with professionals in the digital and performing arts:

- photography
- radio
- sound and light control
- graphic design
- videography
- industrial design
- laser cutting and 3D printing

and a collective project of interpellation to be developed in parallel, specific to each session. Redém'arts has also a European dimension called Kickst'arts: together with Germany and Lithuania, the project aims to conduct a comparative study of the remobilization practices for young people who have dropped out of school through digital arts professions.

Sirius Hub is a digital social innovation laboratory based in Liège. Sirius is first and foremost a free web-based training course intended to people wishing to acquire new technical skills in the digital field. The project is structured on three tracks:

- Back-End (web programming)
- Front-End (web integration)
- Web Design (web-oriented graphics)

At Sirius, we are convinced that acquiring new technical skills is an efficient way for our audiences to find employment quickly. In addition to employment in companies, Sirius is part of a real process of creation in the social economy: the Sirius digital social cooperative. At the origin of the project are several trainees who attend the non-profit organization and have qualities in the field of computer science. They are the ones who expressed the wish to set up this coding “school”. We support their initiative and are

convinced that a project such as Sirius can effectively promote the socio-professional integration of its beneficiaries, whether they are refugees or not.

With a view to the creation of the Sirius cooperative, we aim at the empowerment of the participants, (e.g. people of foreign origin, the unemployed, young unemployed people, etc.). At Sirius, everyone is welcome as long as they demonstrate a real desire to train in web professions (back-end / front-end / web design) in the field of social economy and show an interest in entrepreneurship matters!

Our efforts are oriented towards a single objective: to create a digital social cooperative, generate economic activity, generate income, and make Sirius members think about how to use the income generated. Through this project, we wish to offer a professionalizing perspective to current learners and future members of the Sirius cooperative.

Coming from 69 different countries, the trainees of Le Monde des Possibles present varied degrees of knowledge and mastery of technologies, as well as a strong heterogeneity of uses. The Métiss'ages project invites people who have never had the opportunity to use a computer before arriving in Belgium, but also others who are already computer-literate and who are thirsty for an update (given the very swift evolution of the digital market offer). The co-participation of seniors and migrants in the project represents a change of perception thanks to the adoption of new points of view that take into account new stories and testimonies.

Being in contact and collaborating with undocumented people opens up unexpected horizons, such as discovering experiences related to the realities of discrimination, the visit closed centres, radical changes in their lives as emigrants and immigrants, and the uncertainty of the future. Group dynamics remain a key tool in the construction of intergenerational and intercultural dialogue to combat individualism imposed by the dominant system while learning about new technologies and digital creation.

The School of Solidarity (École des Solidarités) is built on a synergy between associations, the trade union organisation FGTB and the desire to unite in a movement for regularisation, to create new laws. In this case, it is a question of taking into account an economic and social reality that is of everyone's concern, because the persistence of a situation of lawlessness for a part of the population (even undocumented migrants) constitutes a risk of contagion to the whole civil society. Concretely, the School of Solidarity is a 10 half-day training cycle structured by workshops on rights (access to decent housing, residence permit, urgent medical aid, decent work, training for social promotion, reporting to the police...). These workshops generate many testimonies, life stories on the motivations to go to Europe, on living and surviving in Belgium, on the participants' conception of what resilience experienced on a daily basis can be. The articulation of struggles and desires of other parts of the population that are also the object of neoliberal policies is worked on in common platforms such as Actors of the Present Times. The School of Solidarity responds to the needs of foreigners to know their rights and duties.

For some months now, European municipalities have been seeking to develop initiatives on their territory in favour of the fundamental rights of migrants residing there — regardless of their residence status — in a national legal and political context that is often hostile to them. It is in this sense that the City of Liège, the European Trade Union Confederation, the CEPAG, Le Monde des Possibles and the FGTB (federal level) will work in 2020-2021 on the Union Migrant Net (UMN) project supported by the European AMIF Fund (Asylum & Migration). Concretely, civil servants from Sofia, Athens, Ljubljana, Milan, Trieste and Liège will work on the practicalities of the gradual enhancement of public services to the reality of the needs of migrant people.

The activities considered are:

1. Exchanges between partners in Liège (migrant people, the voluntary sector, trade unions, social economy enterprises, etc.), which will address the rights of migrant workers in the formal and social economy's response.
2. Workshops with officials from partner cities on their specific approaches, their regional & national legal framework, possible alliances (see C-MISE, Eurocities, Solidarity Cities, City of Refugee, etc.).
3. A handbook of best practices/recommendations that can be transferred to other cities (recognition of know-how, status of workers, existing social economy initiatives (School of Solidarity, Social Interpreting, etc.).
4. A closing symposium to identify paths for development and link UMN's learning to existing systems. UMN will be an opportunity for Liège to promote innovative practices for the inclusion of migrants in the commune, and to continue the implementation of the motion 'Liège, ville hospitalière' (Liège, a hospitable city) by drawing inspiration from its European neighbours.

The central mission of the Interreg TREE project (Training for integrating Refugees in the Euregio) is based on the continuing education of social workers, teachers, medical staff and interpreters in order to better support migrants in the partner regions of the Meuse-Rhine Euregio. Further planned training modules will help professional and voluntary workers that are active in refugee work to better fulfil their task of supporting and training migrants in the Meuse-Rhine Euregio.

The aim is to give new migrants from different countries, especially refugees, the opportunity to actively participate in their integration and shape their future. With the added value it provides, TREE sets a new

milestone towards community spirit, participation and empowerment in the process of Euregional integration.

In its work, TREE benefits from the extensive experience of the Euregional partners, all of whom are specialists in their respective fields and view the integration process from different angles. The pooling of experiences creates synergies and a perspective-rich approach to meet the challenges of the Euregio. The training is provided in French (Belgium, Walloon Region), German (Germany, Aachen) and Dutch (Netherlands, Province of Limburg). The aim is to professionalize the actors in the field of integration of refugees, in 3 key competences including intercultural communication (Module where Le Monde des Possibles is specifically active):

1. Identifying cultural influences, representations, one's mission and their possible effect on one's own actions;
2. Take into account the life trajectory of a refugee from a systemic point of view;
3. Adapting communication to the interlocutors and the situation;
4. Coping with psychological distress and traumatized populations.

Some asylum seekers and undocumented migrants who are in great precarious situations do not have the opportunity to keep their administrative and confidential documents in a safe place, they carry them permanently and regularly handle them according to the various social and legal services they use. These documents deteriorate and make it all the more complex to examine the files/respect their rights, as they are not subject to any secure digital sharing.

These documents address, for example, family reunification, debt mediation, housing, allowances, employment, asylum procedure, health, children's schooling... Next Step offers to organize offices to digitize administrative documents, to keep them on a flashdrive, to ensure their conservation and to put them in contact with institutional workers that will facilitate access to the rights of migrants (by ensuring the respect of the General Data Protection Regulation).

KICKST'ARTS is an international project funded by Erasmus+ KA2 and coordinated by Le Monde des Possibles, in partnership with Kids & Co (Berlin), and Active Youth (Vilnius). We are working together with the aim of comparing our field practices in terms of inclusion of young people who have dropped out of school and/or are not in a position to be employed. KICKST'ARTS also aims to share our best practices by producing a methodological guide for youth associations, but also for formal education in order to offer activities related to the problem of dropping out. Young people in partnership contexts are invited to participate in the thinking process and the search for innovative solutions that concern them.

LIÈGE, A HOSPITABLE CITY


A hospitable commune is a commune which, by voting on a motion, undertakes to improve the information and welcoming of migrants, regardless of their status. It facilitates procedures for all migrants. Asylum seekers, but also other people who are sometimes in an even more precarious situation, such as undocumented migrants. It is committed on at least two levels: to raise awareness of migration issues among its population, and to concretely improve the reception of migrants while respecting their rights.

A hospitable commune is committed, at its level, to a migration policy based on hospitality, the respect for human rights, and the values of solidarity. On November 27, 2017, the Liège City Council unanimously adopted a motion of this type, declaring Liège a hospitable city. The text, drawn up on the initiative of the CNCD 11.11.11 and

an associative and militant collective led by Point d'Appui, contains commitments on the part of the municipal services to affirm the desire to make the city responsible, welcoming and open towards people of foreign origin. Le Monde des Possibles is an active member of this collective. The Liège Hospitalière collective meets regularly with the municipal services to ensure that the content of the commitments is respected: police, CPAS (public welfare centre), civil status, training facilities, etc. It fights to safeguard the dignity of people of foreign origin with or without papers. This vigilance enables the fundamental rights of migrants to be asserted, but also enables a dialogue to be established around the daily problems of these people in Liège, in order to find lasting solutions in consultation.

POLITICAL ADDRESS

Asylum policies, the crisis in Lampedusa, the tragedies that are being experienced at the borders of European countries are having an impact on the methodologies and learning that we are co-constructing together. We do not have a formal educational situation, we should rather talk about the implementation of individual and collective know-how both in the ability to question oneself, to question one's values/norms and in the ability to question politics and civil society. This is an ongoing process for everyone; both our team as well as project participants.
